

- 4. Eric's presentation lasted 11 minutes.
- **5.** The student who spoke about President Johnson spoke 4 minutes less than the student who received a B.
- **6.** Of the student who spoke for 7 minutes, and the student who got an A on their assignment, one spoke about President Reagan and the other was Eric
- 7. Of the five students, there was Paul, the student whose presentation lasted 7 minutes, the student who received an A, the student who received a C- and the student who spoke the longest.
- **8.** The student whose presentation was on President Johnson spoke 2 minutes longer than Jack
