- ⇒ The Green house is immediately to the right of the Ivory house.
- ⇒ The Old Gold smoker owns Snails.
- ⇒ Kools are smoked in the Yellow house.
- ⇒ Milk is drunk in the middle house.

- ⇒ The Norwegian lives in the first house.
- ⇒ The man who smokes Chesterfields lives in the house next to the man with the Fox.
- ⇒ Kools are smoked in the house next to the house where the Horse is kept.
- ⇒ The Lucky Strike smoker drinks Orange juice.
- ⇒ The Japanese smokes Parliaments.
- ⇒ The Norwegian lives next to the Blue house.
