- The owner of the orange house doesn't play the tuba.
- The musician who placed 14th plays the kettle drums, but does not live in the red house.
- The musician who plays the violin is not Robert.
- The musician who plays the kettle drums finished after Robert.
- The person in eleventh place lives in the orange house.
- The owner of the red house is neither Frank nor Sam.
- Of the 5 people there was the owner of the orange house, Jeanie, the person in eighth place, the musician who plays the violin, and the owner of the green house.
- Frank does not live in the green house.
- The musician in 20th place was Jeanie
- The person in 11th place is not Sam.
