

## Movie Buffs Associated - John Wayne - Logic Puzzle

Every week since its inauguration, the local Movie Buffs Associated have shown a series of movies chosen by a selection panel, determined annually by a ballot of members, in the Municipal Offices function room each evening from Monday to Friday, and starring a particular actor/actress. The selection panel for the current year is Sally Boyden, Mark Thomson, Jessica Farmer, Laurie Davison and Mary Peters.

Last week their choice was John Wayne, and the films chosen - one per member - were Stagecoach (1939), Rio Bravo (1959), The Quiet Man (1952), True Grit (1969), and McLintock! (1963) but not respectively, and neither were they shown in that order, nor in the order in which they were released. Showing time differed each evening. From this information and the following clues, for each member, can you determine who chose which film, the day on which it was shown, and at what time?

1. Sally's choice was the latest release, which had a 7:25 pm time slot.
2. None of the women chose the 1939 release or The Quiet Man.
3. There was a time difference of 60 minutes for the showing of Laurie's choice and the Thursday showing.
4. Stagecoach had a mid-week showing after 8:00 pm.
5. Jessica chose the 8:45 pm movie, which was not Rio Bravo.
6. None of the men chose a movie shown before 8:00 pm.
7. None of the women chose the Monday movie.
8. True Grit was shown before McLintock!
